

## Possible Privileges Menu

Please read through the following items and select the ones you think could serve as privileges or positive activities for your child.

Learning Activities	
	Select a book for the entire group to read Help a peer with an academic assignment Help the clinician to present a lesson (e.g., by crossing off the schedule for the day as missions are completed, assisting cooperative learning groups on an activity)
	Invite an adult "reading buddy" of child's choice to read with child
	Listen to books-on-tape
	Play academic computer games
	Read a book of his/her choice Read a story aloud to another peer
	Read aloud to the class
	Select a class learning activity from a list of choices
	Select a peer as a "buddy" on an in-class mission assignment
	Select a peer to sit with to complete a cooperative activity
	Spend time (with appropriate supervision) on the Internet at academic sites
Helping Roles	
	Be appointed timekeeper for an activity: announce a 5-minute warning near end of activity and announce when activity is over
	Be given responsibility for assigning other peers to helping roles, chores, or tasks
	Complete chores or helpful activities around the academy classroom
	Deliver announcements to the group
	Help with cleaning duties
	Be an "Agent Assistant" (assist main agent in leading an activity)
	Assist in delivering privileges at the Academy when cadets cash in their points

## ☐ Be awarded a trophy, medal, or other honor for expected behaviors/caring attitude ☐ Be praised on group announcements for expected behaviors or caring attitude ☐ Be praised privately by the main agent or other adult ☐ Help design or post a positive note about child on main Agency Classroom ☐ Get a silent "thumbs up" or other sign from lead agent indicating praise and approval ☐ Have the lead agent call the child's parent/guardian to give positive feedback about the child ☐ Have the agent write a positive note to the child's parent/guardian ☐ Post drawings or other artwork in a public place ☐ Post writings in a public place ☐ Receive a "good job" note from the agent Prizes/Privileges/Rewards ☐ Allow child to call parent(s) ☐ Be allowed to sit, stand, or lie down anywhere in the classroom (short of distracting other children) for brief breaks ☐ Be dismissed from the Academy 2 minutes early ☐ Be given a 'raffle ticket' that the child writes name on and throws into a fishbowl for prize drawings ☐ Be permitted to sit in a reserved section of the classroom ☐ Be sent to outside recreation activities 2 minutes earlier than the rest of the group ☐ Draw a prize from the group 'prize box' ☐ Earn points or -tokens to be redeemed for prizes or privileges ☐ Have first choice in selecting materials (e.g., marker color, invisible pen, etc.) and/or seating assignments ☐ Have lunch with the lead agent ☐ Receive a coupon to be redeemed a home for a preferred activity ☐ Receive a sticker ☐ Receive candy, gum, or other edible treats ☐ Select a class fun activity from a list of choices ☐ Earn a pizza party with the group ☐ Sit near the lead agent ☐ Take the lead position in line ☐ Tell a joke or riddle to the class Recreation ☐ Be selected by the agent to accompany another child to a fun activity ☐ Get extra outside time
